




We need more of a downtown

Preservation of Open Space to maintain quality of life in Southborough is of primary importance.

We need to control Japanese knotweed on an urgent basis. It has already taking over the open land near the water and trails,

Dog Park, water recreation. Lots of dog owners here and many of the main trails are not dog friendly, dog parks are very popular and well used in other towns. Lots of water here that can only be looked at. Seems like some sort of compromise in the middle from no use to ski boats that still maintains water quality if needed.

All of the survey points above could be interpreted in a variety of ways. In general, my belief is that the town missed a huge opportunity with the golf course acquisition - and I'm hoping that in time, that will turn around. That space, in particular, would have made (and still could make) for a fantastic community gathering area - with space for recreation, socialization and perhaps even great indoor space with a real community center. What does not make sense, in this taxpayers mind, is random acquisition of a small piece of property here or there, scattered all over town, that really does not benefit the town or taxpayers overall. So, "strategic acquisition of additional open space" might mean one thing to the author of the survey, and something entirely different to me. I would love to see a survey with more detail about the kinds of things that fit into each of the above categories. For example, where would a project to put more sidewalks and safer space for biking fit in? Those are green initiatives in that the more people can move about the town safely without cars, the less emissions. That would also lead to more recreation and better health for those who choose to use those resources.

Particularly with Coronavirus situation the vulnerability of our food source has become apparent. We need to make a concentrated effort to preserve Prime Farmland Soil. It is a critical resource for the town. Another area that has become obvious is better resources for walking. Although we have many trails in town some have become overcrowded. This is in large part because we do not have parking areas to provide more access. There are no parking areas in Southborough for the Bay Circuit Trail or the Reservoir Tail. Having multiple access to these resources would eliminate crowding but in non pandemic crisis the additional lots would prevent overuse of the only trails that have parking while allowing people the ability to experience additional resources. Without adequate sidewalks residents can't just walk to many of these places.

Given the chat on the town facebook page it seems that unleashed dogs on the trails are the most significant hazard people face. Failure to enforce existing rules is a liability to the town. Get the police involved, make signs, work with Recreation to enforce this rule across town.


