## EXCLUSION OF HEAVY COMMERCIAL VEHICLES


On September 13, 1982 the Southborough Board of Selectmen


VOTED: That the Traffic Rules and Regulations of the Town of Southborough adopted on November 14, 1972, be and are hereby amended by adding at the end of Article VII, Section 7-19, Operation of Heavy Commercial Vehicles, subsection 1, the following:

The use and operation of heavy commercial vehicles, having a carrying capacity of more than 2½ tons, are hereby restricted on Central Street. The alternate route will channel heavy commercial vehicles east on State Route #9 into Framingham to the "Marlboro Cutoff", then west on Firmin Avenue to State Route #30, then west on State Route #30.


